The International Academic Office

Registrations for University of the Arctic Circumpolar Studies online courses are managed by the International Academic Office (IAO). The Academic Coordinator at the IAO will register you in your course at the offering institution, keep a record of completed UArctic coursework, and may assist with credit transfer issues. Acceptance is not guaranteed. Once your application is received, the Academic Coordinator at the IAO will inform you about your acceptance into your chosen class(es).

BCS Course Prerequisites

The Circumpolar Studies core courses have the following prerequisite requirements:

- BCS 100 is the prerequisite for BCS 311, 321, 331, and 332
- BCS 100 and BCS 311 are the prerequisites for BCS 312
- BCS 100 and BCS 321 are the prerequisites for BCS 322

BCS Course Completion

Upon successful completion of all seven core courses: BCS 100, 311, 312, 321, 322, 331, 332, the IAO will issue a “Confirmation of Achievement” document to acknowledge your accomplishment.

Tuition

Tuition is due upon registration and is non-refundable after the first day of class.

Course Withdrawal

To assist students in avoiding academic penalties, the International Academic Office may act on your behalf to withdraw you if you have failed to log on to your class website for 14 days without prior approval from your instructor.

To prevent academic penalties, you must immediately inform your instructor and the Academic Coordinator at the IAO when you intend to withdraw from an online Circumpolar Studies course.

Transcripts and Credit Transfer

As UArctic is not a credit granting institution, it does not grant degrees. The IAO will retain your transcript until you request it sent to an institution of your choice.

As the student, it is your responsibility to determine if credits for the successful completion of online Circumpolar Studies courses are acceptable at your institution and in your program. Transfer is always at the discretion of the receiving institution.

Language Requirements

All international online Circumpolar Studies courses and web discussions are held in English. English language skills must be at a level to enable a student to comprehend readings and participate fully in the course.
