**The Fulbright Arctic Chair Award  
for  
Distinguished Norwegian Researcher/Lecturer to the USA  
Academic year 2010-11**

**A three-month Fulbright Arctic Chair Award is available for a research scholar/lecturer in any of the academic fields of Arctic Geology, Arctic Biology, Arctic Geophysics and Arctic Technology for the 2010-11 academic year. A similar award was advertised for an American lecturer/researcher to Norway.**

Application deadline: October 1, 2009.

Grant Activity: Lecturing component in collaboration with host university of the candidate's choice, within any of the 4 academic areas: Arctic Biology, Arctic Geology, Arctic Technology and Arctic Geophysics. Conduct research on scholarly issues within the above academic areas. In addition, the Chair is expected to engage with faculty inside and outside the institution, give public lectures, seminars, supervise Master's and Ph.D. candidates with their research and writing, as well as mentoring.

Language: English

Additional Qualifications: Ph.D. in Arctic Biology, Arctic Geology, Arctic Geophysics and/or Arctic Technology or in a closely related field, including polar and high north issues, and 5-10 years teaching and/or research experience.

Location: Any accredited U.S. university to be selected by the applicant. A letter of invitation is required from the host university. The selected university in the U.S. should excel in arctic and polar research and preferably have some collaboration with a Norwegian university in this field.

Length of Grant: 3 months within the academic year 2010-11. The start date has to be agreed upon jointly between grantee and the host institution.

Award details: This award provides NOK 150 000 for a 3-month grant, covering maintenance and housing. This Fulbright funding will be offered for a total of 3 months, but the grantee may stay beyond the 3-month Fulbright grant period. There is no financial support for dependents but family members may accompany grantee to the site.

Travel/Relocation: Round-trip international travel is available for the grantee only. A flat sum of

NOK 10 000 -12 000 will be given to the grantee depending on the U.S. university's location. Return baggage allowance of NOK 1 000 is also provided. These travel stipends are in addition to the maintenance stipend.
