Dr. Karen Barnes, President & Vice-Chancellor, Yukon College

Dr. Karen Barnes has been the President of Yukon College in Whitehorse, Yukon since 2011. Prior to her appointment as President, Dr. Barnes served as Yukon College's Vice President of Education and Training and as such was responsible for establishing the Centre for Northern Innovation in Mining. Before coming to Yukon she served as the Dean of Applied Arts and Science at Lethbridge College for six years.

Currently Dr. Barnes chairs the governing committees for the Yukon Research Centre and the Northern Institute of Social Justice. In addition, she has served as a board member of the Mining Industry Human Resource Council of Canada and was also appointed to the Saskatchewan Higher Education Quality Assurance Board in 2012, and served as Vice-Chair until 2018.

Much of Dr. Barnes' career has been devoted to issues of access and retention for marginalized communities. She co-chaired the CIGan committee that developed the Indigenous Protocol for Canadian colleges and institutes. She currently works with other college presidents in Canada to raise the profile of colleges serving rural and remote communities. Since coming north, she continues to work closely with the other two territorial colleges in support of seeking pan-territorial solutions to research and education. Dr. Barnes holds a BA and a Professional After Degree in Education from the University of British Columbia, and a M.Ed (Adult Education) and a Doctorate in Education (Policy Studies) from the University of Alberta.

Short CV, Anne HUSEBEKK



Anne Husebekk was elected Rector (Chancellor) of UiT The Arctic University of Norway in 2013, and was re-elected for a second term in 2017. As Rector, she is also Chair of the Board of Governors of the University.

Professor Husebekk is a physician by training (MD, specialist in immunology and transfusion medicine), and has a leave of absence from her position as professor in immunology at the Faculty of Health Sciences while serving as Rector. Her field of research is platelet immunology - specifically fetal and neonatal alloimmune thrombocytopenia (FNAIT), a potentially life threatening condition affecting fetuses and newborns - and she has been head of a research group studying the alloimmune response from basic biology all the way to a prophylactic treatment for pregnant women aiming at preventing the immune response and FNAIT. She served as vice president of the International Society for Transfusion Medicine from 2008 to 2012.

Having served as a member of the board of the Division for Society and Health at the Research Council of Norway from 2012 to 2015, professor Husebekk has recently been appointed as a member of the board of the Research Council's Division for Science.

In January 2014, professor Husebekk was appointed by Norway's Prime Minister Erna Solberg as the Norwegian member of a Norwegian-Swedish-Finnish group of experts tasked with identifying potential areas of business development in the Scandinavian Arctic. The group's report - Growth from the North - was presented at the Arctic Frontiers Conference in Tromsø in January 2015.

Letter of recommendation

In 1983 graduated from Arkhangelsk State Pedagogical Institute; in 1990 got PhD in Philosophy. Since 1996 DSc in Philosophy, Professor, Fellow of the Russian Academy of Natural Sciences (RANS).

Research interests: social economy, social management, social analysis, gender research, science policy, education policy, international cooperation. The author of over 100 scientific papers and monographs, supervisor for 32 PhD papers. Had research internships at Oxford University, University of Oslo, George Washington University, Kennan University.

In 1999-2008 acted as the Head of Research and Higher Education Dpt. in Arkhangelsk Region Administration; 2008-2010 – Vice-Governor of the Arkhangelsk Region for Social Affairs

Since June 8, 2010 – Rector of the Northern Arctic Federal University appointed by the RF President.

The University of Alaska Fairbanks is pleased to nominate Evon Peter to the UArctic Board of Governors.

Evon Peter has served as Vice Chancellor for Rural, Community and Native Education at the University of Alaska Fairbanks since July 2014. Vice Chancellor Peter manages six community campuses and sixty workforce-bridging academic and student services programs that serve one hundred and sixty communities across Alaska. These include programs at the certificate to doctoral level in indigenous studies and research. A UAF alumnus, Vice Chancellor Peter is Neetsaii Gwich'in and Koyukon from Vashraii K'oo (Arctic Village), Alaska where he served three years as the tribal Chief. He currently serves as a board member to the Gwich'in Council International, which represents Gwich'in nation interests in the Arctic Council forum. He is a UAF alumnus, having earned a baccalaureate degree in Alaska Native studies and a master's degree in rural development.

Vice Chancellor Peter is a celebrated Alaska Native leader, advocate of indigenous peoples' well-being, youth, and a balanced world, active as a statewide, national, and international speaker, strategist, program developer, and film producer. His recent work has focused on incorporating indigenous knowledge and practices into behavioral health interventions and leadership development. He recently completed production of a nationally broadcast film, *We Breathe Again*, which documented the impacts of intergenerational trauma and suicide on the lives of four Alaska Native people over a two-year period.

We are particularly proud of Vice Chancellor Peter and his accomplishments within our university, across Alaska and throughout the world. Evon is widely respected throughout the U.S. for his eloquent and insightful discussions on the rights, needs and abilities of indigenous peoples. We are confident that he will represent our university well and serve UArctic very well. I hope you will accept this nomination.

I am pleased to nominate Ross Virginia to the University of the Arctic's Board of Governors. Ross, who has been a Professor of Environmental Studies at Dartmouth for 25 years, has, since 2003, also been the Director of the Institute of Arctic Studies at Dartmouth. Thanks to his efforts, the Institute has become a major center for Arctic research, while he has been an influential voice on campus for continuing to strengthen Dartmouth's commitment to this area. He has been a lead scholar on the Fulbright Arctic Initiative, and he has trained many graduate students over the years. In addition, Ross has helped establish an active student exchange with the University of Greenland (where he serves as a Board member). He was also instrumental in obtaining a grant to enable Dartmouth graduate students to carry out research in Greenland.

Ross's own research has focused on the ecology of Antarctica's dry valleys. Supported by four six-years grants from the National Science Foundation, he has made 21 trips to Antarctica, studying the conditions that support life in Antarctica's soils. In recognition of his many years' work on that continent, one of the dry valleys has been named Virginia Valley in his honor.

For many years Ross has also been involved with the University of the Arctic. From the start he has been a leading figure in the Institute for Arctic Policy, co-founded with the University of Alaska Fairbanks, and he has been a member of the UArctic Council since 2004. Among his many other activities associated with the Arctic, I will just mention his position as an associated scientist at the Stefansson Arctic Institute in Akureyri, Iceland and his serving as Dartmouth's representative to the Arctic Research Consortium of the United States (ARCUS).

Ross would bring to the Board his administrative experience at Dartmouth, his extensive contacts with others who have worked in the field, and his expertise on Arctic scientific matters. Dartmouth, through the Institute of Arctic Studies, would be happy to support his membership on the Board.
