<b>University name</b>	Université Laval
<b>Facts and figures</b>	Located in the UNESCO world heritage city of Québec, Université Laval boasts a tradition of excellence for its academic programs and research activities. <a href="#">For more information</a> .
<b>Language of instruction</b>	<b>French:</b> Minimum required level of TFI 750, DELF B2 <b>English:</b> Solely in business administration as well as English literature and linguistics
<b>French-language test</b>	<b>BCI :</b> the result of a test must be attached to the student's file certifying that he has the required level. <b>Bilateral agreements :</b> For non-francophone institutions: if no test results are provided, your students will be required to take the French online test from <a href="#">Université Laval's École de langues</a> (ELUL).
<b>French as a foreign language</b>	If your students do not have the required level of French, they can take courses in <a href="#">French as a foreign language</a> during the summer semester, or even during the fall or winter semester. The School of languages charges activity fees for Français langue étrangère (FLE) level courses.
<b>Programs available for incoming exchange students</b>	<b>International profile:</b> According to the agreements signed by each program of studies <b>General Agreements:</b> Admission is not guaranteed. Acceptance is subject to program director approval. Some programs are closed to exchanges; <a href="#">please see the list of open programs</a> . (Available in French only) <b>BCI :</b> <a href="#">please see the list of open programs</a> (Available in French only).
<b>Course selection</b>	Pre-arrival selection with home university academic advisor required. <b>Confirmation of course selection at Laval at the beginning of the semester, subject to course availability and program director approval.</b> Students wishing to take a <b>language course</b> must take a placement test before the start of the semester. Places in these classes <u>are limited</u> .

<b>Application deadlines</b>	<b>Nominated students have 7 days to complete their application form.</b>																				
<b>Recommended arrival date</b>	One week before the beginning of classes.																				
<b>Student card and Student ID</b>	Each student will receive a student card and an email address. The student card gives access to the Sports Complex ( <a href="#">PEPS</a> ), <a href="#">library</a> , etc.																				
<b>Accommodation / Housing options</b>	<p><b>On campus residence halls:</b> A limited number of rooms are reserved for exchange students. Students admitted will receive a special reservation form with their application form. We recommend that they wait to receive confirmation of their admission prior to booking their room. Please note that the leases are for 8 months, and students who come for only one semester will end their lease as stated in their contract.
