NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCESS

To nominate students, partner institutions must contact inbound.globalme@lakeheadu.ca to have access to the nomination form

While nominating, partner institutions must submit the following two supporting documents:

- English proficiency attestation letter*
 Academic transcript (in English)
- Shortly after being nominated, students will receive an email from Lakehead containing instructions on how to complete the web-based application form through our Ontario Universities' Application Centre

*A letter of attestation stating English proficiency is all that is required for admission.

Do **NOT** submit official English test scores (IELTS, TOEFL, etc.).

There is no need to undergo official English Language testing for your exchange at Lakehead University.

Restricted Study Areas

Law, Nursing, and some Social Work and Education courses are restricted from inbound Global ME students. Inbound Global ME students are not permitted to take Masters or PhD level courses, with the exception of selected partners.

Program, Course Load and Grading System

- Program offerings are linked <u>here</u>.
- Students can register for a maximum of 2.5 FCE (Full Course Equivalent) per semester, which is typically 5 courses. One course that runs for one semester is worth 0.5 FCE and consists of 36 lecture hours. Typically, 0.5 FCE = 6 ECTS = 3 AU (Example: 5 courses = 2.5 FCE = 30 ECTS)

Official Transcript

- **Fall Semester (September-December)**: In mid to late January, Lakehead will email an official transcript to your home institution mobility program coordinator.
- Winter Semester (January-April): In mid to late May, Lakehead will email an official transcript to your home institution mobility program coordinator.

Student Accessibility Services

Student Accessibility Services (SAS) coordinates services and facilitates the provision of academic accommodations for students with **temporary and/or permanent disabilities/medical conditions**.

- As a student with a disability and/or a medical condition, it is your right to be accommodated.

THUNDER BAY

Accommodations are divided into 3 types of housing choices: residence halls, apartments, and townhouses. Inbound Global ME students attending the Thunder Bay campus for 1 semester are typically placed in our residence halls, which include an unlimited meal plan. For students staying for 2 semesters, they are sometimes granted a room in an apartment/townhouse upon request.

ORILLIA

Inbound Global ME students attending the Orillia campus will stay in single-room accommodations with a shared bathroom. Students must opt-in to a 5-day or 7-day mandatory meal plan and do not have access to their own kitchen.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS, STUDENT FEES & PRICING

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA), or Temporary Residence Visa (TRV), or Study Permit

STUDY DURATION UNDER 6 MONTHS:

Students who are citizens from <u>visa-exempt</u> <u>countries</u> who will be studying in Canada may be eligible to enter Canada with an eTA. More information can be found <u>here</u>.

Students from **non-visa-exempt countries** may require a TRV in order to enter Canada. More information can be found <u>here</u>.

STUDY DURATION OVER 6 MONTHS:

Inbound Global ME students are permitted to study at Lakehead University for over 6 months. If you are studying in Canada for over 6 months, you will require a Study Permit from the Government of Canada (information here). You will be exempt from obtaining a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL).* Additional information here.

*Please note that visiting (fee-paying) inbound Global ME students **do not** qualify for a PAL-exemption and are only permitted to stay for 1 semester.

HEALTH INSURANCE*

Inbound Global ME students will be automatically enrolled and billed for the mandatory health insurance plan (Guard.Me)¹ at a rate of \$1.95 CAD per day (approx. \$234 CAD per semester). This will allow access to medical services on and offcampus. Students will receive a digital copy of their Guard.Me¹ health coverage by email prior to their arrival in Canada. ANCILLARY FEES*

Ancillary fees provide access to university services and facilities. These fees include a one-time Orientation & First Year Experience Fee of approx. \$84 CAD, plus per-course fees, which vary depending on a student's selected campus.

- Thunder Bay: Approx. \$52 CAD per 0.5 FCE
- Orillia: Approx. \$46 CAD per 0.5 FCE

Approx. ancillary fees according to registration:

Thunder Bay	Courses Registered	Orillia
\$344 CAD	2.5 FCE (1 semester)	\$314 CAD
\$604 CAD	5.0 FCE (full-year)	\$544 CAD

NOTE: Students coming through the National Student Exchange (NSE) will not be required to pay ancillary fees.

• Approx. \$6,300 - \$7,500 CAD per semester

• Approx. \$50 -\$100 CAD per course
